ANZAC and Gallipoli Information

A picture of my father who was on the HMAS Bundaberg for 3 years till the end of the war in the mess room during WW11. The HMAS Bundaberg was a corvette (corvette HMAS Castlemaine has been restored and is permanently berth at Williamstown pier) a small fast ship which spent most of its time protecting navy supply ships sailing to New Guinea. The last task for the ship was to bring POWs back to Australia from New Guinea.

It was the day of the 'Landing at Gallipoli' when more than 20,000 Australians and New Zealanders and some servicemen from other countries went ashore at the Gallipoli Peninsula. They fought the soldiers of the Ottoman Army, mainly up on the ridges well beyond the beaches. The first group ashore landed at dawn; they were the so-called 'covering force' whose task was to drive the Turkish defenders into the hills. After that the main force would come ashore.

Deaks

While still training in the Egyptian desert in late 1914, the 1st Australian Division and the New Zealand Division, which later included the 1st Light Horse Brigade, were re-formed into the Australian and New Zealand Army Corps – the ANZACs.

Harvey

After four months of training in Egypt, the ANZAC troops left for Gallipoli. At dawn on 25th of April 1915 they landed at a now known as ANZAC Cove. The landing was nightmarish the beach was at the bottom of a steep slope, meaning that the ANZACS had a tough and dangerous struggle to climb up the beach.

Jade

The Gallipoli battle was in 1915. WW1 lasted 4 years. The ANZAC's landed in Gallipoli in 1915, on the 25th of April.

Kye

Boats took Australian & New Zealand soldiers to the shore of Gallipoli from Egypt. While the British and French attacked from the sea.

Lachlan.C

April 25 1915, was the day the ANZACs landed on the Gallipoli Peninsula to battle the Turkish army during WWI. More than 11,000 ANZACs died on the Gallipoli Peninsula.

Lilly

The battle at Gallipoli started on 25th April 1915 and ended on 9th January 1916.

Lockhlan Glare

The mothers, sisters and wives left behind during World War 1 sent Anzac biscuits made of oats, sugars, flour, coconut, butter and golden syrup sent to their husbands, sons and brothers. The last surviving Anzac, Alec Campbell died on May 16, 2002. More than 11,000 Anzacs died on the Gallipoli Peninsula despite only being there for 8 months.

Macey

Record numbers attended ceremonies at the Australian War Memorial on Anzac Day 2013 with 35,000 attending the Dawn Service and a further 17,000 attending the National Ceremony.

Mia

ANZAC day falls on the 25th of April each year. The 25th of April was officially named ANZAC day in 1916 one year after the Australians landed on Gallipoli.

Stephen

April 25, 1915 was the day that soldiers came to Gallipoli. The soldiers thought that the Gallipoli landscape was flat with a slight slope but when they got there, there were cliffs. 362 officers died and 7,779 soldiers died. 26,000 men landed.

Travis

The last surviving ANZAC, Alec Campbell, died on May 16, 2002.

ANZAC was originally named the Australasian Army Corps. However protests from New Zealand led to the adoption of Australian and New Zealand Army Corps. Administration clerks found the title too long and adopted the abbreviation of ANZAC.

Lachlan Bates

ANZAC Day occurs on 25 April every year. On this day we honour all the men and women who have participated in wars, conflicts and peacekeeping operations around the world, including the ANZACs (Australian and New Zealand Army Corps) who fought at Gallipoli in Turkey during World War I.

Ruben

April 25, 1915 was the day the ANZACs landed on the Gallipoli peninsula now known as ANZAC cove to battle the Turkish army during WW1.

Jordi

Simpson and his donkey helped the injured day and night. Simpson and his donkey rescued around 300 wounded soldiers.

Hailey

More than 11,000 ANZACs died and 23,500 were wounded. ANZAC day is a national day of remembrance in Australia and New Zealand.
