Day 1 of 2020 has ran very smoothly. I would like to take this opportunity to again welcome the whole school community back to the 2020 School year. It is an exciting time at Beverford District Primary School with growing enrolments

Thank you to Kaiti Blackmore (Middle Classroom) and Abbey Fairley (Junior Classroom) who have worked tirelessly over the holidavs planning inclusive. an differentiated and engaging curriculum to teach the students in Term 1. The classrooms look great and we are all looking forward to working closely with all families this year.

I encourage everyone to pop into school early in the year if you get an opportunity to have a casual chat with your child's teacher and to check out the classrooms and working environment. If you are available to help out in the classrooms, listen to reading, assist with lunch orders or anything that would help please let me know by the end of Week 2. We will be having a Lunchtime Meet and Greet Picnic next Thursday February 6.

In staffing news, Mrs Blackmore will take Family Leave at the end of Term 1. We will begin the process of employing a permanent replacement teacher in the coming weeks. We start the school year with 29 students, but have our fingers crossed that this will grow throughout the year. During Literacy and Numeracy the school will be ran in three classrooms with 6 students in the P-2 classroom, 13 students in the 3/4 room and 10 students in the 5/6 class. The school will run in two classrooms for other subjects and also all day on Fridays.

The MARC Van with Mrs Leahy will visit the school from 9.30am to 1.00pm on Wednesday. The Swan Hill Mobile Library will visit the school fortnightly on a Wednesday starting next week. A whole school timetable is attached to this newsletter.

Homework

There have been some changes to the homework program at the school. All students are encouraged to read every night and have their reading diary signed at least 3 or 4 times a week by an adult.

All students from Grade 1-6 will have spelling homework each week to be completed in their Homework book or Spelling Booklet. Spelling is sent out on Friday and returned the following Friday.

Students in Grade 3 – 6 will also complete a Maths Mate Sheet that will be sent home on Friday and returned on the following Friday.

To support students who may struggle to find time at home to complete their homework we will be running a Homework Club on Thursday at lunchtime starting in Week 2. Homework will begin in Week 2 of every term.

Students will have a blue-labelled homework bag that needs to be brought to school every day. This will contain readers, their reading diary, the homework book and any other communication between home and school such as notes and newsletters.

School Council

The first School Council meeting for this year is on Wednesday February 19. The Annual General Meeting and organisation of the new Council is on March 18. If you are not currently on School Council please seriously consider nominating, it is a great way to have a voice in key decisions around the running of the school.

Meet & Greet Picnic

A casual Meet & Greet Picnic has been organised for next Thursday February 6. This is an opportunity for parents/carers to drop in have lunch, meet the staff and also have a look around the school. It will run from 12.30pm to 2.00pm.


