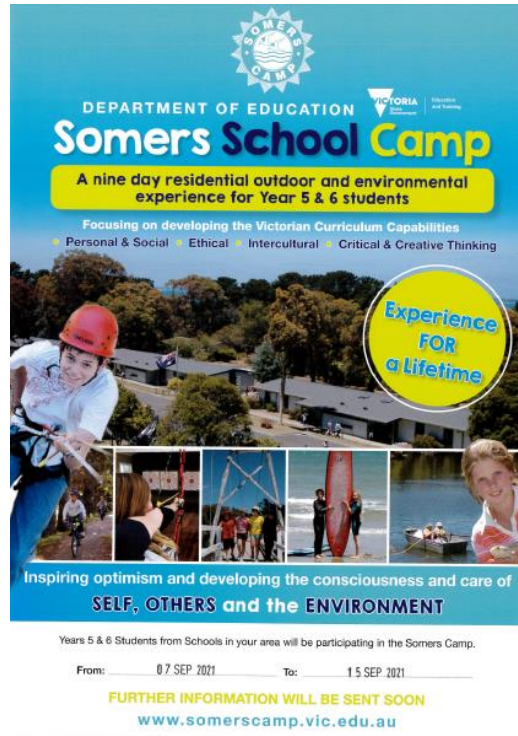

Somers Camp (GR5/6 only)

On September 7 to September 15 this year, Grade 5/6 students from our school along with the network have the opportunity to participate in the Somers School Camp. The nine day experience is heavily subsidised by the Department of Education, however there is a \$260 cost to parents. The school will not receive its student allocation until later in the year and generally there is far more interest than there are places available. A fair process will be decided on to fill our allocation if we need. The dates of the camp clash with Divisional Athletics at Kerang on September 13, if a student attends Somers Camp they will not be able to compete in the Divisional Athletics if they qualify.
