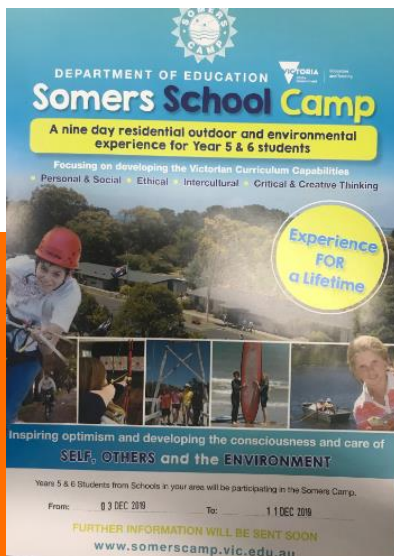
2020 Prep Enrolments

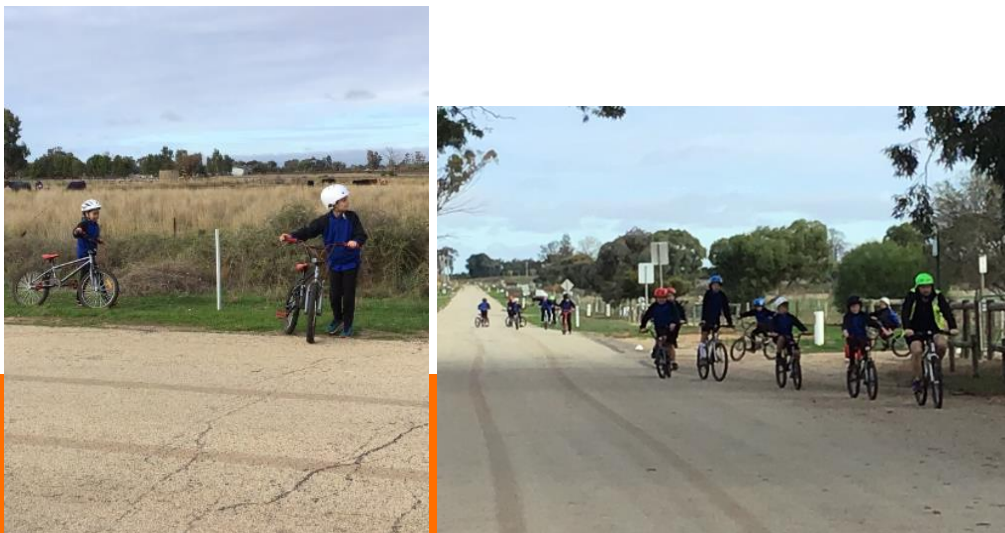
