


Bring on Friday

Principal's Report

New return date on Roadmap

It has been wonderful to see all of our students over the past few weeks face to face onsite. It's great to have our Grade 3-6 students **transitioning back to school** successfully.

As I am sure you are aware, all P-6 students return to face to face learning onsite this Friday October 22. This date has been brought forward by the Victorian Government. I would like to take this opportunity to say thank you to all of our families for the way you have tackled remote learning. It is not easy for anyone, but by working together in a partnership we are getting through this.

I am sure the number of active COVID-19 in the Swan Hill LGA has caused stress and worry over the past week. We have been following the strict protocols and procedures set out for Victorian schools. This now includes all students in **Grade 3-6 wearing face masks** at school and when travelling on the bus. A reminder that if a family member or student has undertaken a COVID test, please contact the school when this occurs and again when the result is received. This information remains confidential.

The school has been working on our **Emergency Management Plan**. This has included recent works on the grounds with the upcoming bushfire season. Due to its location the school is deemed a Grassfire risk, with this classification on Code Red Days the school bus will be unable to run and the school is closed.

With our students all returning to school this week, we are hopeful that we may be able to start to plan our **Prep Transition Program**. At this stage it is scheduled for four consecutive Fridays beginning on Friday November 19. However, we are keen to tailor the program to best suit our new families. At this stage we have 7 Prep students for 2022, but would welcome more! We are going to continue to promote the school through social media and the radio, but the best form of advertising is word of mouth. So please get the word out there about our wonderful school, great kids, great staff and very supportive families.

Last week we welcomed past BDPS student Haylea Hazlett to school as a Pre-service teacher. **Miss Hazlett** is working with Miss Salau in the Senior Room and has settled in well and will be with us until Friday November 5.

A reminder to parents that we have a school council approved **Pupil Free Day on Monday November 1**, which is the day before the Melbourne Cup public holiday. Staff will be using this time for planning curriculum for Weeks 6 to 11.
