Principal's Report


Welcome Back for Term 4!



The staff of the school are extremely proud of the parent opinion results as displayed and thank you for the positive partnerships we have formed with every home.



School Review

I attended a planning meeting on Tuesday to organise the first day of our school review which will take place on Tuesday October 22. Many documents, policies, procedures, self evaluations and student data have already been sent to our reviewer Chris Tanner and the other panel members.

The panel consists of six team members including:

- Craig Tanner (Reviewer)
- Graeme Scoberg (SEIL)
- Sophie Shadbolt (Council President)
- Marty Gray (Assistant Principal – Swan Hill North)
- Kristie Bennett (Principal – Woorinen District PS)
- Phil Cox (Acting Principal)

The first day on October 22 is entitled the Validation Day, during this day the panel will validate the self evaluation and school data to assess whether the school has met the goals set in the 2016-2019 Strategic Plan. The process also assesses the school against the Department of Education's Framework of Improving Student Outcomes (FISO). There are 16 dimensions in this framework that the school is assessed against. This self assessment will help form goals for the next strategic plan.

During the Validation Day the panel will also observe the classrooms in action and speak to students about their thoughts, opinions and experiences at the school. If the reviewer requires further information a parent forum may be organised on the second review day on Wednesday October 30. If required this will be advertised through the newsletter.

At the conclusion of the review the school will be able to construct the 2020-2023 Strategic Plan that will set goals and actions for the next four years. If you have any questions about the process or feel strongly about being involved on the second review day on October 30, please contact me at school.
